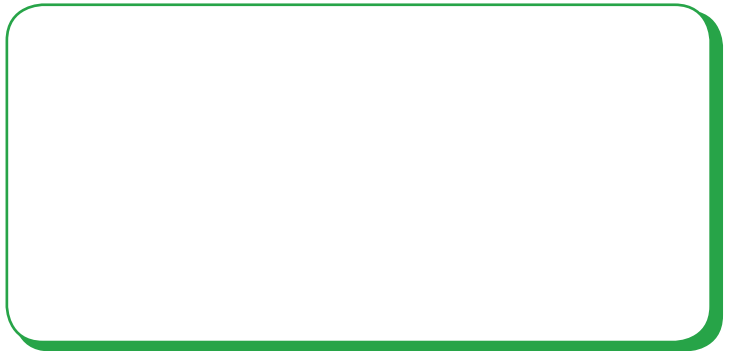

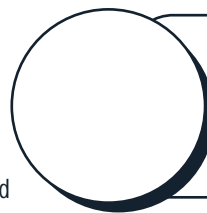
Apply for Federal Student Aid



Who gets federal student aid?

Some of the most basic eligibility requirements for students are that you must

- be registered with Selective Service if you're a male between the ages of 18 and

- maintain satisfactory academic progress in college, career school, or graduate

- » completing a high school education in a home-school setting approved under
- » enrolling in an eligible career pathways program.

I completed the FAFSA® form. Now what?

After you submit your FAFSA form, you'll receive a *Student Aid Report* address in your application, you'll receive an email with instructions on how to access an online copy of your SAR within three days (if you apply at **fafsa.gov**) or three weeks (if you mail in a paper FAFSA form).

When you receive your SAR, review it to make sure you didn't make any mistakes on your FAFSA form.
